2. Provide a copy of a letter of acceptance from a college or university.
3. Provide a letter of recommendation from current art instructor.
4. Complete ALL of the forms for Student Activities. List of Awards, and GPA.
5. Provide High School transcripts to date. Please indicate if GPA is weighted.

Since 1973 the AGOP has encouraged the advancement and interest of visual arts. We provide opportunities for development and enrichment of our members through educational programs and workshops.



In keeping with our mission we established a Scholarship Fund in 2002 for Clay County High School Seniors to pursue a career in visual arts or arts education.

The Art Guild welcomes guests to our monthly meetings on the first Monday of each month (September - May) from 6:30-8:30 p.m. We meet at the Fox Valley Community Center, 150 Fox Valley Drive, Orange Park, FL, 32073.

Meetings include social time, with food and drinks followed by a short business session. The evening highlight is the featured guest artist who demonstrates and discusses their art medium. Many of the guest artists also teach a workshop sponsored by the Art Guild.

He was commissioned to paint a portrait of Andrew Jackson which hangs in Jacksonville's City Hall.
